Dear Friends

A student had just graduated from University and secured a job working as an Education Welfare Officer. The essence of the job was to help families who for one reason or another were finding it hard to get their children to go to school. Sometimes this meant working with the young person and at other times it involved working closely with the family.

One instance was when a young person was referred to the graduate whose job it was to go out and meet with the family and so it involved quite a lot of cold calling. The graduate would stand alone on the doorstep hoping that the person answering the door was friendly, not too large and fully dressed.

As time went on the graduate became more aware of the inherent danger of the situation, there on his own with no back up and no mobile phone.

In considering this story it seemed to me that over 2000 years ago a man called Jesus had a better understanding of how to protect those around him from danger. When Jesus sent people out to tell others about what he was doing he sent them out in pairs. He sent them out with support. He sent them out, so they could encourage one another, but also because they could share the experience of the journey.

The American author Gina Greenlee once said this: 'When we establish human connections within the context of shared experiences we create community wherever we go.'

Often the word we use in church for these deep, shared communities is **fellowship**. Fellowship is about being part of a community that holds devotion to Jesus' life, death and resurrection as its highest principle and lives out its shared life in response to that. Fellowship is part of developing a meaningful community and a meaningful church community that is built on our shared faith in Jesus.

Fellowship is praying together, encouraging one another, building up each other, teaching one another and setting an example to each other. It's about sharing life together, not just on the surface, not just passing the time of day or asking how the weather is. It's about being willing to enter the other person's world and about creating a community where we feel confident enough to be vulnerable.

Pastor Rick Warren describes fellowship like this: Fellowship is a place of grace, where mistakes aren't rubbed in but rubbed out. Fellowship happens when mercy wins over justice.

Fellowship creates spaces where real life can happen and where real support through love and grace can happen. That is what I pray for St Andrew's Church. My hope is that this church can be a place where that happens, not just with one person but with the whole community. My hope for you, the congregation, is that you have places where you find community, and, in that community, you find real, lasting, true fellowship where your mistakes are rubbed out and never rubbed in.

The Garioch Partnership has been working towards an asset transfer of Market Place Primary School. We are now at the stage of gathering letters of support for this. Our hopes are to keep the building in public use, as a hub for the third sector, which would benefit the community and small business start-ups in the middle of the town - not tucked out of the way at Thainstone, or Crichiebank. We would keep it affordable thus within reach of many individuals and groups.

In the short-term there would be access to building and general facilities. In the future we would wish to develop affordable childcare and to support people back into education, training and work. We would also encourage a wide variety of community and arts groups into one central location – and who knows – maybe even some tourist information on the wealth of activities that Inverurie and the Garioch have to offer! As the facility develops, so

will the ideas with the engaged users of a truly community facility be implemented.

If we are successful, the partnership can continue to develop and grow which will offer our communities new and exciting opportunities to come together in affordable, accessible space – right in the centre of Inverurie. 100 YEARS | 100 DAYS | 2 MINUTES remembrance100.co.uk

REMEMBRANCE Remembrance 100 (Note from editors: More will be written in our Church November magazine about the end of the war, but we felt this particular article was relevant for this month's issue.)

> On 4th August 1918 King George V met to pray with members of the Houses of Parliament. One hundred days later, the war ended. This year, 4th

August 2018, will be the first day of 100 days of prayer across the country, running until Armistice Day in November. Every day there will be prayers, Bible readings and reflections written by contributors from UK churches, ministries, chaplaincies and the Armed Forces' Christian Union. These 100 Days of Peace and Hope can be downloaded, a week at time www.remembrance.co.uk for churches and individuals to print and use.

In an introduction to 100 Days of Peace and Hope, the Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby says, "From 4th August let us mark 100 days with prayers for peace, hope and reconciliation.' On Sunday, 11th November 2018, people around the Commonwealth will mark the centenary of the end of World War 1. As well as reflecting on loss, this year also gives us the chance to look forward as we mark the end of World War 1 and pray for peace."

Remembrance 100 has been set up by HOPE, in partnership with a cross section of Christian denominations and ministries, to help

churches bring communities together to mark the centenary of the end of World War HOPE has also published a beautifully illustrated booklet called Silence to give away at Remembrance events. Silence invites readers to look back with gratitude for the sacrifice made by so many in war, and to reflect on eternal themes of faith, hope and love.
