9th June Day of Pentecost – Whit Sunday

Pentecost took place on the wellestablished Jewish festival of Firstfruits, which was observed at the beginning of the wheat harvest. It was seven weeks after Easter, or 50 days including Easter.

A feast day to celebrate the country's wheat harvest does not sound exactly world-changing, but that year, it became one of the most important days in world history. For Pentecost was the day that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit - the day the Church was born.

Jesus had told His disciples that something big was going to happen, and that they were to wait for it in Jerusalem, instead of returning to Galilee. Jesus had plans for His disciples – but He knew they could not do the work themselves – they would need His help.

And so they waited in Jerusalem, praying together with His other followers, for many days. And then on that fateful morning there was suddenly the sound as of a mighty rushing wind. Tongues of flame flickered on their heads, and they began to praise God in many tongues – to the astonishment of those who heard them. The curse of Babel (Genesis 11: 1- 9) was dramatically reversed that morning.

That morning the Holy Spirit came to indwell the disciples and followers of Jesus: and the Church was born. The Christians were suddenly full of life and power, utterly different from their former fearful selves. The change in them was permanent.

Peter gave the first ever sermon of the Christian Church that morning: proclaiming Jesus was the Messiah. His boldness in the face of possible death was in marked contrast to the man who had denied Jesus 50 days before. And 3,000 people responded, were converted, and were baptised. How's that for fast church growth!

Of course, Pentecost was not the first time the Holy Spirit had acted in this world. All through the Old Testament there are accounts of how God's Spirit guided people and strengthened them. But now, because of Christ's death and resurrection, He could INDWELL them. From now on, every Christian could have the confidence that Jesus was with them constantly, through the indwelling of His Holy Spirit.

News from the

General Assembly 2019

The General Assembly 2019 opened on Saturday 18th May with the installation of the new Moderator Rt. Rev Colin Sinclair. Representing the Queen was the Duke of Buccleuch who addressed the Assembly. The retiring Moderator Rev Susan Brown also

addressed the Assembly. Following a time of worship led by the Moderator, the Assembly welcomed Delegates and visitors.

Monday opened with Holy Communion conducted by the Moderator. The main business of the day was the Report of the Special Commission which was charged with the task of reforming the Management of the Church. This is to be achieved in as prompt a timescale as possible by a top tier comprising a body with a wide range of experience, skills, gender and geographical balance ... to be called The Assembly Trustees who will appoint a Senior Management Team. The aim is to streamline the running of the Church and make savings of at least 20%.

This was followed by the Report of the Social Care Council who outlined the great work being done by the Church through Social Care and Crossreach such as the Bungalow at Stonehaven which enables 5 people with support to live quality lives, and also the invaluable help given to Prison Visitor Centres.

On Tuesday, the main discussion took place on the Radical Plan which again is designed to restructure the way the Church is organised. The report of the World Mission Council outlined the work of the Church worldwide, in cooperation with partners of all faiths under extremely difficult conditions. There has to be careful negotiation to try and influence change in areas of difficulty, such as blasphemy laws in Pakistan. Positives include work in Egypt where, among other helping projects, was the provision of a children's playground funded in part by the BB.

The Guild reported on their activities, not only in Scotland but also around the World – a series of support visits had been started – so far the North has been completed and overall membership is up by 500. Again, the Guild have been very generous with donations to the Church and also to various charities such as Crossreach, BB, Malawi etc.

Wednesday opened with a speech from the First Minister, Nicola Sturgeon who praised the Church for all the work and support it gives both at home and worldwide.

On Thursday, the Chaplains to the Armed Forces were praised and thanked for their invaluable work supporting and ministering to all branches of the Navy, Army and Airforce.

The Report from the Youth Assembly was received with admiration for the enthusiasm of the Youth of our Church (including Olivia Paterson from the West Church) – something we should care for and nurture. Indeed there was much demand that they should receive more financial support to enable them to develop as they are the future of our church.
