#### St Andrew's Safeguardimg Statement

(Relating to the Protection of Children and Young People in the Church. Adopted by the General Assembly, May 1997.)

The Church of Scotland has a deep concern for the wholeness and well-being of each individual. I seeks to safeguard the welfare of all people, regardless of age, who come into contact with the church and its organisations.
