#### **Dear Friends**

It never ceases to amaze me how people and events in the Bible have so much to say to us today. When we first meet Saul, he was holding the cloaks of the men stoning Stephen, the first Christian martyr, and he 'was among those who approved of his execution.' (Acts 8:1) Saul then made it his personal mission to put a stop to the early church. In Jerusalem, many Christians were persecuted by the actions of Saul but, as he headed to Damascus to continue his campaign, he had a miraculous encounter with Jesus. As a result, Saul, the persecutor of the early church, became Paul, the Apostle who spread the Gospel to

countless gentiles throughout the Mediterranean region – suffering beatings, stonings and shipwrecks in the process. As Paul set out on his final trip to Jerusalem, where the Holy Spirit had told him to expect imprisonment, he sent for the church elders from Ephesus and told them that they would not see his face again. He warned them of dangers they would encounter and reminded them of their duty to help the poor (Acts 20:17-35), and that, 'It is more blessed to give than receive.' (Acts 20:35b, NKJV).

When the word 'giving' is mentioned, we tend to think of money, but it can be so much more. In St. Andrew's, we are blessed that we have many people who give their time and talents. We could not achieve a fraction of what we do without their practical generosity.

The pandemic has had a devastating effect on various aspects of our lives. Many have struggled with the restrictions imposed to limit the spread of the virus and, while we are gradually returning to something like normality, these effects will likely be felt for a long time to come. More immediately, throughout the country, the past eighteen months have hit church finances hard. St. Andrew's is no different, as two of our major income sources, social events and lettings, were significantly reduced. To address this, the National Church suggests 'National Giving Days', where each congregation nominates one day, during September and October, to have an extra collection to recoup some of the lost income. Any money raised will not be included in the congregation's assessable income, which is used to calculate the Ministries and Mission contribution, instead it will remain with participating congregations to decide how best to use it.

Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> October will be National Giving Day in Inverurie St. Andrew's. On that day, those who wish, and are able, may make an additional contribution to the collection. As this money must be accounted for separately, please put it in a sealed envelope, clearly marked 'National Giving Day' before placing it into the offering.

Thank you, in advance, for any contribution you make, but please remember, as well as 'It is more blessed to give than receive', Paul also wrote, 'Each person should give as he (she) has decided for himself (herself); there should be no reluctance, no sense of compulsion; God loves a cheerful giver.' (2 Corinthians 9:7)

#### News from the combined Congregation Board/Kirk Session Meeting held on Wednesday, 8th September 2021 at 7 pm , via a Zoom Video Conference.

#### **Key Points**

- A tribute to George Whyte was given by Alastair Smith (see page 8).
- The Treasurer reported that with the return of social events together with an increase in givings in August, has positively helped our financial wellbeing.
- The Social Committee reported that the Harvest Lunch is sold out. Tickets are on sale for the Christmas Afternoon Tea. Plans progressing well for next year's Platinum Celebrations which will include a Flower Festival.
- The majority of hall users have now returned along with a number of new groups using our facilities. This is a much needed source of income for St Andrew's.
- Communion to be held during the service on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> September.
- It was agreed fresh flowers can restart in the church along with deliveries. The flower calendar is in the church vestibule.
- It was decided that the Harvest Service on 3<sup>rd</sup> October will be, as in previous years, an opportunity for people to donate, if they wish, to the Foodbank. National Giving Day will be on Sunday 31<sup>st</sup> October *(see page 4)*.

# Currently we have very <u>good</u> supplies of **pasta**, **soup**, and **tea bags**, thanks to your generosity.

We have seen a marked decline in donations coming in but we are not surprised by that, given the current economic climate affecting so many people and the increasingly empty supermarket shelves. People can't donate what is not there to buy!

In August, across our network of 5 food banks in Inverurie, Huntly, Ellon, Peterhead and Fraserburgh, we received food donations weighing 4,592 kg and gave out food parcels weighing 10,603 kg. In the first 5 days of September, as I write this, we took in 461 kg of donations and have distributed 1127 kg of food to people in food poverty. Even without using a calculator, you will appreciate that we are concerned!

Please be assured that we value so much all you do to support the work of Aberdeenshire North Food Bank. We know that times are tough for many of you and we only ask that you donate what you can easily afford to do.

## **Tribute to George Whyte**

"George Whyte was a lovely man" – these words have been expressed by many who knew him, always pleasant and happy to chat if you met him.

George was the son of a fisherman, born in Inverallochy on 5<sup>th</sup> Oct 1922, and was brought up in the area with his sister and 2 brothers. Sadly his Mum died aged 40 when George was just 13, and times were hard but George continued to find jobs such as on farms, picking tatties and carrots and helping at the hairst – he also got a job with a fish salesman in Fraserburgh.

George began to serve his time, prior to the outbreak of WW2, as a moulder in the foundry in Fraserburgh, biking to work every day from home in Inverallochy. This was a reserved occupation and important business, which warranted a visit from Stafford Cripps, a member of the War Cabinet, with whom George was photographed and this photo is featured in a book about Fraserburgh in wartime. As a way of helping the war effort and local community, he served for the duration of the war with the auxiliary fire service.

After the war, George did his National Service with the King's Own Scottish Borderers, serving in Palestine and Egypt, rising to the rank of Sergeant. (One of the roles was guarding the King David Hotel in Jerusalem and the day after he left for Egypt, the hotel was destroyed by a bomb – so was it a lucky escape or did the bombers wait till George left??).

After the war, George returned to the foundry but, after a year, decided to take his hobby of photography further and so enrolled on a 2 year course at Blackpool, where he paid his way by hotel work, washing dishes and as a waiter. After graduation, he worked at an Aberdeen Studio where he gained experience and confidence to set up his own studio, which he built in Constitution Street, where his life in Inverurie would begin in 1953. (For those new to Inverurie, the studio was where Craig & Beverly and the Fire Station are now located).

George's business led him to be the first in the area to do school photos and weddings at the latter he met Nellie whom he married in 1954 and who was his constant companion till her death 4 years ago. George was always very fussy and professional about poses and settings for his photos – as can be seen in the photos of the Kirk Sessions in the hallway – a very serious bunch as befits "proper upright Elders"!!

George was a keen and excellent bowler, both indoor and outdoor, becoming President of both the Inverurie Bowling Club and the carpet bowling at the Town Hall. The highlight of his playing career was winning the "Champion of Champions" in the Bennachie League. Then he qualified as a coach and umpire, the highlight of this phase being as an umpire at the Scottish Championships at Queen's Park.

As a long serving Elder and District Elder of St Andrew's Church he gave of his time freely in various roles. This included financial generosity – all in a quiet and kindly way.

George was well loved and respected over his long life and will be remembered for his kindness and generosity in many ways, always quietly without fuss. This can be exemplified by a poem written by the officer in charge of the Auxiliary Fire Service who wrote :-

#### " Now George a silent chap is he, but aye he gives his best,

I think he'd fairly like to flee – I've never seen him rest!"

**Junior Section** also embarked on the first part of a Chocolate Theme night which included a section of the boys making their own designed chocolate bar. A "Charlie and the Chocolate Challenge" will be concluded next week. Both Sections were pleased to see our Minister ,Rev Carl Irvine, who came and spoke with the Anchors about David and Goliath and conducted a Smarties Prayer with the Junior Section.

**Two of our Senior boys** attended a residential Queen's Badge Skill course near Aviemore and, although they came back very tired, they said it was GREAT and how much they enjoyed it. This year they will be busy working towards the Queen's Badge.

**Company Section** enjoyed playing a bit of blind football where they are blindfolded and need to listen to the ball which was purchased from the Blind Association. We have also managed to attract a new Helper in the Junior Section with the arrival of Christine, and we are sure she will be invaluable once all her registrations are complete.

Our annual Dedication Service took place on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> September and was attended by most of the boys and their parents and even grandparents. They were very well behaved and enjoyed an engaging address by our Chaplain, Rev Carl Irvine, who also presented them with membership badges. Two boys - Jack Kelman and Andrew Strachan - received their President's Badges, the second highest awards for boys. They also read the lessons and are now working towards the Queen's Badge, the highest award. To this end they have just attended a weekend training course. Torin Wattcarried in the Bible and presented the offering for dedication and perhaps one of the highlights was from one of the Anchor Boys – George Martin - who helped to clear tables after teas, which was well received by the ladies and admired by all.
