Our Minister's Letter

Dear Friends

I am sure that you are familiar with the term 'Sabbath Day'. For Christians, this is, Sunday, traditionally a day of rest. But are you familiar with the term 'Sabbath Year'? In Leviticus (25), God instructed Moses to tell the people to plant and harvest crops in the normal way for six years, but every seventh year was to be a 'Sabbath Year', when the land should rest from being planted. In a Sabbath year, people would gather and eat whatever grew naturally, and God promised bumper crops every sixth year to see them through. In this way, the land had a year to replenish its goodness,

Every fiftieth year, (i.e. after seven Sabbath years) was a 'Year of Jubilee', during which a big 'economic reset button' was effectively pushed. Any land that had been sold, since the last Jubilee, was to be returned to its original owner (or their family), all debts were cancelled, and people who had been forced, by debt, to sell themselves into slavery were freed. This meant families who had fallen on hard times, would not condemn their descendants to poverty, and families who prospered, would be unable to hoard wealth. As a result, each generation was in charge of their own financial destiny.

Jesus publicly announced His Messiahship, after reading from the scroll of Isaiah (61:1,2a) in the synagogue in Nazareth, stating, Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.' (Luke 4:21b) It's interesting that the reading ended 'to proclaim the year of the Lord' favour.' (Isaiah 61:2a and Luke 4:19) 'The year of the Lord's favour' was another name for 'The Year of Jubilee'. As we have seen, this was marked by an economic equalling out; family land returned, debts cancelled and economic slaves freed. It was a year of lifting the poor out of poverty. Similarly, Jesus' mission was to lift the whole world out of a different poverty: Sin! In relating His mission to the Year of Jubilee, Jesus made clear that His work was a continuation of God's saving Grace, especially for those in need.


In Acts 2, we read about an extraordinary event on the Jewish festival of Pentecost, a harvest festival, celebrated fifty days after Passover. On that particular Pentecost, shortly after the resurrected Jesus ascended to heaven, His apostles and other early believers were together, 'Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.' (Acts 2:2-4) This marked the beginning of the church, as the gift of the Holy Spirit drove it forward, throughout the world.

This month, a very different Jubilee is being celebrated around the country. However much you join in with these celebrations, remember God's 'Year of Jubilee', embodied by Jesus' mission and enabled to grow by the Holy Spirit, and try to spread 'the Lord's favour' just that wee bit more.

Platinum Jubilee Concert: On Sunday 29th May afternoon a Platinum Jubilee Concert was held in our church. Alan and Eileen Robertson originally thought up the idea and it is thanks to their inspiration that the concert came to fruition.

Amidst the magnificent floral crowns which decorated the church, an array of local talent charmed and entertained some 200 folk. A variety of beautifully played piano pieces from our very own organist, Ian Milne: a thought provoking excerpt for the Mitchell School of Drama's latest play, "A Monstrous Regiment of Women" highlighting the influence Kintore born Caroline Philipps had on the British Suffragette movement; great Scottish tunes played with expertise and enthusiasm by accordionist Steve Innes and Bruce Edmond on fiddle; Alan Robertson singing from the heart the well loved song, "Caledonia" as well as songs from The Eagles and Robbie Williams; Sheila Craggs, a "weel kent" person in St Andrew's, whose soprano voice thrilled the audience with songs from the musicals "Cats" and "West Side Story" as well as two lovely ballads from her native Northumberland; Ramsay Tough, a brilliant 12 year old pianist who stunned the audience with his rendering of "The Dark Island", followed by a modern classical piece by South Korean composer, Lee Ruma, and then a most scintillating version of "In the Mood"; Kellands Primary School Choir, conducted by their music teacher, Leigh Tough*, delighted everyone with their three well chosen songs; and finally Steve, Bruce and Ian led the audience in a Scottish singalong which had everyone singing lustily with hands clapping and toes a tapping!
